- Do each of your paragraphs link to the next one?
- Have you included persuasive tools?
- Have you checked your spelling and grammar?

### CONCLUSION

- Did you re-state your point of view?
- Did you briefly re-state your 3 arguments?
- Have you included persuasive tools?
- Did you leave the reader with a strong closing statement?
- Have you included some persuasive tools?

### AT THE END...

Re-read your piece to make sure that all your sentences flow and make sense!  
Check for an introduction, a main body and a conclusion.

Your strongest argument should go first.  
You should use a range of persuasive tools.
