On another sheet of paper follow these steps to write your essay:

Intro Paragraph:

- State your Key question
- Briefly (1-2 sentences each) introduce and explain your 3 supporting questions
- Write a transition sentence to get you into your first paragraph

3 Body Paragraphs (one for each supporting question):

- Use the CER (Claim, Evidence, Reasoning) Method to write your body paragraphs:
 - Claim: first sentence of your paragraph
 - restate your supporting question
 - Evidence: Quotes from text
 - make sure your sources are reliable
 - make sure the evidence is relevant
 - always cite your sources
 - Reasoning: Explain how your evidence proves your argument
 - make sure your explanation is short and understandable
 - avoid adding fluff
 - be specific when providing details
- Use a transition sentence to close each body paragraph

Closing Paragraph:

- Restate your Key question
- Briefly (1-2 sentences each) summarize your 3 supporting questions
- Write a concluding sentence that nicely ties up your argument
