Bill of Rights:

1. Freedom of speech, assembly, petition, religion, press
2. Right to bear arms
3. Gov't cannot force people to house soldiers without consent
4. No searches or seizures without official warrants or probable cause.
5. Right to not testify against oneself, no double jeopardy, no property taken w/o just compensation, right to due process of law
6. Right to a speedy and public trial by jury, right to be informed of crime, right to obtain witnesses in favor
7. Right to trial by jury preserved for civil cases, and no re-examination of facts by any court
8. Excessive bail, excessive fines, nor cruel nor unusual punishments may be inflicted.
9. Right to do things not explicitly stated in the constitution.
10. The powers not given to federal gov't go to states or people.

How a bill becomes a law:

1. An idea
2. Congressman writes bill
3. Bill needs to garner support + sponsor
4. Bill is introduced and sent to all congressmen and committees in that house.
5. Committee members debate bill and may send it to subcommittee.
6. If voted to return to floor, bill is debated by congressmen.
7. Bill is read off and changes are recommended.
8. Bill is then voted on.
9. If majority vote yes, bill passes to other house.
10. See steps 5-8.
11. If majority vote yes, bill passes to president.
12. President can:
 - a. Sign it, in which case it becomes law
 - b. Veto it, in which case it is sent back to congress for another vote, but this time $\frac{2}{3}$ must support it to override veto.
 - c. Do nothing, in which case if congress is in session, after 10 days it becomes a law.
